Competition Rules

Edition 2018, Valid from 1. 1. 2018

This document takes effect on the 1st January 2018

These are competition rules for Parachute World Cup Series (PWCS). For any case not handle in these rules, the Parachute World Cup Series Competition Rules is substituted by the FAI/ IPC Competition Rules or Freefall Style and Accuracy Landing (www.fai.org/ipcdocuments).

1 Disciplines

The events will comprise the following disciplines:

- Team accuracy landing
- Individual accuracy landing

2 Entry Fee

The entry fee:

- 180, 00 € per competitor per events- Rijeka, Lesce, Peiting, Belluno, Thalgau
- 200, 00 € per competitor per event- Locarno (in the case of appreciation of the €, the fee for Locarno will be assimilated to other venues)

(10, 00 € refund for jumps not made)

3 Camera System

Camera System will be used. Only the chief judge has the right to see it for any decisions.

Rijeka (Croatia)- Lesce (Slovenia)- Peiting (Germany)- Belluno (Italy)- Thalgau (Austria)- Locarno (Suisse)

4 General Rules

4.1 Events

4.1.1

Competitors and Judges don't need to have a valid FAI license to take part at the PWCS.

4.1.2

The organizer has to accept following (maximum) number of teams:

- 35 plus 5 (Rijeka, Lesce, Peiting, Thalgau, Locarno)
- 35 plus 7 (Belluno)

4.2 Jumporder

4.2.1

The order of jumping in the first two (2) rounds will be determined by reverse order of placing, based on final result of team accuracy during the last event of PWCS. On first event of the season, the order of jumping is based on overall classification of PWCS from the season before.

4.2.2

Teams not covered by this procedure will jump at the beginning or the end of the first two (2) rounds, as determined by Meet Director of each competition.

The jump order for incomplete teams (4 or less) can change during the round due to organizational reasons.

4.2.3

In all other rounds, the jump order will be the reversed rank order after the last completed round.

The jump order for incomplete teams (4 or less) can change during the round due to organizational reasons also.

4.3 Team Accuracy Landing Event

4.3.1

A team may be composed of male, female or mixed.

4.3.2

There is only one classification in team accuracy landing, no matter team composed of male, female or mixed.

4.3.3

All five (5) scores will count in the team event.



4.3.4

There will be no tie break jumps. In case of tie the three top ranking teams, the winner will be the team having obtained the best score in any one valid round of the event involved. (see example bellow)

If the tie cannot be broken, the teams concerned, the winner will be the team with lower scores from the last rounds. (see example bellow)

If the tie cannot be broken, the teams concerned, will remain tied.

4.4 Individual Accuracy Landing Event

4.4.1

A separate individual classification:

- Male
- Female
- Junior
- Master (50+)

4.4.2

There will be no tie break jumps. In case of tie among the three top ranking competitors, the winner will be the one having obtained the greater number of low scores (i.e. dead centers, 1cm, 2cm, ...). (see example bellow)

If the tie cannot be broken, the athletes concerned, the winner will be the athlete with lower scores from the last rounds. (see example bellow)

If the tie cannot be broken, the competitors concerned, will remain tied. (see also FAI rules AL& FS, point 7. 2, § 3b and 3c).



5 Prize Awarding

5.1

The event consists of eight (8) rounds. The minimum number of rounds for a valid event is four (4).

5.2

1st, 2nd and 3rd place individual competitors (male, female, junior and master) and the top three (3) teams will be awarded a trophy in each event.

5.3

All teams and competitors, who have taken part in a valid event of PWCS, will be given point (see point assignment below).

7 Judges

7.1

Minimum number of judges' panel are Chief judge and 6 judges (2 target panels).

7.2

Chief Judge and Judges (one from each competition point) are invited by the organizer 45 days prior to the competition. The organizer has to arrange the accommodation - a single-room for each judge - and meals from Thursday dinner until Sunday lunch. Every organizer can additionally invite some own judges.

7.3

Additionally to the judges' panel, the organizer is obligated to provide two observing personnel and two result writing personnel at the target.



8 Determination of the Overall Winner

8.1

All teams and competitors, who have taken part in one (1) or more events of PWCS, will be given point.

8.2

It is the liability of the competitors or team to check the points on the website (www.parawcs.com)

8.3

It is allowed to change the competitors in a team during the PWCS season.

8.4

Winner of PWCS in overall classification will be the team/ competitor, which has totalized the highest points. The points will be assigned according to the ranking of each event (see point assignment chart above- 5.3).

8.5

If all six (6) events are valid, the highest five (5) points are counted for overall classification. If five (5) events are valid, the highest four (4) points are counted for overall classification. And if four (4) events are valid, all points are counted for overall classification.

8.6

A minimum of four (4) events must be successfully completed for the trophy to be awarded. If the minimum number of events is not completed, the trophy will not be awarded and the prize money will be added to the next season PWCS prize-purse.

8.7

1st, 2nd and 3rd place individual competitors (male, female, junior and master) and the top three (3) teams will be awarded a trophy.

9 Prize Money

9.1

1st, 2nd and 3rd place individual competitors (male, female, junior and master) and the top ten (10) teams, which have participated in at least four (4) out of six (6) competitions, will receive prize money for overall classification. (See prize money chart below)

9.2

In case of ex tie among the three (3) top ranking competitors or the ten (10) top ranking teams, the competitors/teams concerned, will remain tied.
